# THE PRIORITY OF MISSION

At the Sunday morning service, we are currently going through the Book of Nehemiah and following his progress in building the walls of Jerusalem. He faced much opposition, criticism, and ridicule. However, the work continued, and the walls were rebuilt. The building project of Nehemiah is often seen as a picture of building the Church of Jesus. 1<sup>st</sup> Peter 2:5 likens us to "living stones being built into a spiritual house". We sometimes forget but fundamental to this process of building is mission.

We do not take mission and evangelism and building Christ's Church seriously enough. People need Jesus. They need his forgiveness, his healing, his acceptance. They need to know they are loved unconditionally. Are you

not moved when you see the consequence of man's sin in our society, in our world? Are we not sometimes moved to tears when we read of the abuse, the people trafficking, the drug addiction, and domestic violence – the list is endless? Or do we get accustomed to it? Desensitized? In Luke 19 verse 41 we read, "As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace, but now it is hid from your eyes".

If only people knew. Why don't they know? Because the Church, you and me, have neglected our duty to be missionaries in our own back yard. For whatever reason, we do not share our faith, we do not point people to Jesus. We assume everyone will be alright at the end of the day. God's love will save everyone. Does that not make a mockery of Jesus' death? In Acts 4 verse 12, Peter's sermon before the Sanhedrin, we read, "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved".

I was thinking about mission recently and was convicted of the sin of idolatry. Idolatry is the worship of other gods as you know. The god I am speaking about is the god of friendship. What prevents us from sharing the full gospel of the good news of Jesus is that we value friendships more than we value obedience to God's commandments. In other words, we put friendships before God. The reason is obvious, we do not want to lose our friends. We do not want to look like a religious fanatic, a crank in the world's eyes. The risk is too great. But by withholding the full gospel message, our friends' eternal salvation is at risk. I will leave that with you to think about. And if someone comes into mind when I am saying these things, then take it that God wants you to speak to that person about their salvation.

The greatest challenge to the church in the west is not its survival but rather the challenge of mission and evangelism. We are told that we live in a post Christian era. God's commandments are ignored, Jesus Christ is a swear word and people speak of "their" truth as if truth was relative. Jesus said, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me".

What would be the consequences if we all became missionaries? If we committed to sharing the full gospel with, even one person a week? Would we see a harvest? Would it make a difference in our community and society? If we believe in the resurrection, have we not got something to tell? I finish with the great commission found in Matthew 28 from verse 16, the words of Jesus spoken to his disciples after his resurrection, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age".

# **GIFT AID**

Did you know? Gift Aid is good news for the Church because:

- It increases our giving by 25 per cent
- No minimum contribution is required
- No particular amount has to be promised
- There is no fixed term during which contributions must be made
- Tax may be recovered retrospectively.

All that is required is that the donor must pay UK income tax or capital gains tax, at any rate, at least equal to the amount of tax being reclaimed, and give their offering or donation through offering envelopes or by bank standing order.

Donors must also sign a Gift Aid declaration form, which are available at the Church, or by contacting me.

All existing donors on the Gift Aid Register will be provided with declaration forms which have been updated to represent Aberdeen North Parish Church.

Completed declaration forms should be returned to Aberdeen North Parish Church.
