I wanted to give you a few updates. Firstly the Nominating Committee having been elected have begun their work. The committee's work is confidential, so they will not be giving any updates until such times as they have a candidate to bring to the congregation as sole nominee. As tempting as it is, please do not be asking them how they are getting on, as they will not be able to tell you anything.



The second update is with regards to the buildings. Outline planning permission is being sought for small housing developments at both Northfield and Summerhill. The idea is to market them with this in place. This process has taken longer than anticipated but the Kirk Session were pleased to hear from Ian Murray the North East Presbyteries Buildings Officer about progress to date at their meeting on the 9 August.

With regards to the church at Mastrick, we sadly have had to take the hall out of commission because of a woodworm infestation. This has pushed the Kirk Session to think of how to make the Sanctuary useable for things other than worship. To that end they are looking at the removal of the pews and replacing them with comfortable seating. Be prepared for some changes to take place shortly. I anticipate this be done in stages.

One further update is to let you know that Claire has been off work following a wee accident which caused damage to her shoulder. Claire will hopefully be back to work around the 24th of August. I hope you will join me in praying for her recovery.

We're grateful for the work Martin has been doing as he carries out his duties as Locum. It certainly makes my life easier knowing that you are well looked after.

I continue to be inspired by the dedication and hard work of folks around Aberdeen North. You have faced the challenges of establishing the union and the buildings issues with determination and grace. You are an example of how to be church. It remains my pleasure to be your Interim Moderator.

In all we do, we do it with God by our side. Psalm 139 reminds us that God is on every side, there is no escaping God's love. It is a Psalm I turn to when things get tricky as it reassures me I am not alone. It is equally a Psalm for the good times too, reminding us that God is in everything. Maybe a Psalm to look up for yourselves.

GIFT AID

Did you know? Gift Aid is good news for the Church because:

- It increases our giving by 25 per cent
- No minimum contribution is required
- No particular amount has to be promised
- There is no fixed term during which contributions must be made
- Tax may be recovered retrospectively.

Gift Aid donors must pay UK income tax or capital gains tax, and give their offering or donation through offering envelopes or by bank standing order.

Donors must also sign a Gift Aid declaration form, available at the Church, or by contacting Peter Ewen.

INSTANT NEIGHBOUR

It is a sad fact that many people in the UK increasingly find themselves relying on food banks.



Aberdeen is no exception, especially as living costs are increasing daily; people find it more and more difficult to make ends meet, and there is increasing anxiety about staying warm this coming winter when faced with such high energy prices.

Instant Neighbour has provided emergency food parcels to individuals in serious need for over twenty years. Whenever someone requests a food parcel, Instant Neighbour carries out a brief, informal assessment of their needs and provides a food parcel containing 2-3 days of emergency provisions.

Thanks to everyone who continues to donate so regularly—every single item is appreciated by someone in Aberdeen!

BLYTHSWOOD SHOEBOX APPEAL

Following the success of last year's appeal, Kirk Session has agreed to support the Blythswood Shoebox Appeal— and you can see in the photo just some of the 169 shoeboxes filled and beautifully wrapped by the congregation in 2021!

Blythswood Care is a Christian organisation, based in Evanton, north of Inverness; for many years it has distributed boxed gifts of warm hats and scarves, toiletries, pens and pencils, sweets, toys and treats, to the poorest across Eastern Europe. So much



of what we take for granted, like clean socks, shampoo or a toothbrush is a luxury beyond their means. That someone has cared enough to send something to someone they don't know is itself a precious gift!


Blythswood adds to each box a Bible storybook for children, a book for teenagers or a calendar with Bible verses, so that the precious love of Jesus is shared at Christmas.

There are many ways in which you can help. If you would like to prepare a gift, there will be a supply of empty boxes available at the church from early September, along with leaflets outlining what is required. However, any donations of suitable items for inclusion such as sweets (but no chocolate), stationery, new clothing items or toiletries would be very welcome!
